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4	Legislative Action to Repeal Medicare SGR Payment Formula

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8 9	WHEREAS, The Sustainable Growth Rate, or SGR, is a major component of Medicare's
10	current formula for determining annual updates to physician reimbursements for services; and
11	current formand for determining annual apaates to physician remoursements for services, and
12	WHEREAS, The continued use of the SGR will dramatically cut physician reimbursement rates, while
13	practice costs continue to rise and the number of Medicare beneficiaries increases; and
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15	WHEREAS, The CMS's measure of the annual increases in the cost of medical practice is based on the
16	Medicare Economic Index (MEI); and
17 18	WHEREAS, Using the projections from the 2008 Medicare Trustees' report, real or inflation-adjusted
19	physician reimbursement will be cut by 46% from 2009 to 2015 (with MEI used as the inflation
20	measure); and
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22	WHEREAS, According to a 2006 AMA Member Connect Survey, 67% of physicians say they will
23 24	decrease or stop seeing new Medicare patients if the scheduled eight years of cuts take place; and
25	WHEREAS, According the VTDOH 2006 physician survey only 71% of Vermont's primary care
26	physicians are accepting new Medicare patients compared to 87% in 1996; and
27 28	WHEPEAS Following a 5.4% reduction in normants for physician convises in 2002. Concrease has
28 29	WHEREAS, Following a 5.4% reduction in payments for physician services in 2002, Congress has recognized the damaging effect of the SGR on access to appropriate medical care for Medicare
30	beneficiaries by blocking similar pay cuts in 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008: and
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32	WHEREAS, physicians cannot continue to be threatened with yearly payment cuts as medical practice
33	costs are expected to increase by 41 percent from 2001 to 2015 according to Medicare's estimates; and
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35 36	WHEREAS, If the Medicare physician payment update system is not reformed, Medicare payment rates in 2010 will be cut by over 21%; and
30 37	Tates in 2010 will be cut by over 21%; and
38	WHEREAS, MedPAC, an independent government oversight body created to advise the Congress on
39	issues impacting the quality of and access to care for Medicare beneficiaries, recommends that
40	Congress repeal the SGR formula before a crisis of access develops; now therefore be it
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42	RESOLVED, That the Vermont Medical Society work with other state and national
43 44	organizations representing physicians to urge Congress to repeal the Sustainable Growth Rate formula for physician payments by the end of 2009; and be it further

46	RESOLVED, That the Vermont Medical Society work with the AMA and other state and
47	national organizations representing physicians to urge Congress to enact a long-term solution
48	to replace the SGR with an updated system that reflects increases in physician practice costs,
49	including support for physician efforts to invest in health information technology and quality
50	measurement.
