1 VERMONT MEDICAL SOCIETY RESOLUTION 2 3 Working with the Green Mountain Care Board to Develop the 4 **Vermont Health Resource Allocation Plan** 5 6 Adopted October 25, 2014 7 8 Whereas, The Physician Needs Assessment was conducted by the Vermont Medical Society Education and 9 Research Foundation for the Green Mountain Care Board to gain insight and actionable information about 10 the needs of Vermont's physicians and their patients; and 11 12 Whereas, The Board's support for this research effort directed towards getting practitioner input on policy 13 issues should be the beginning of a partnership with physicians and other health professionals who share the 14 Board's interest and passion to make the state a better place for those in need; and 15 16 Whereas, A theme that resonated throughout the interviews was the fear of physicians losing their 17 traditional role as keepers of their professional ethic, namely ensuring that they and their peers practice to 18 the highest standards and that patient interest is always placed in front of their own; and 19 20 Whereas, Physicians strongly feel that the current practice environment allows too little time to see their 21 patients and requires too much time attending to financial, regulatory and administrative requirements; and 22 23 Whereas, Without a change to these dynamics, physicians feel that practices' ability to deliver safe, timely, 24 efficient, and effective care will be severely eroded; and 25 26 Whereas, The Green Mountain Care Board has statutory responsibility for developing the Vermont Health 27 Resource Allocation Plan and the professional healthcare workforce that directly interacts with patients is 28 the paramount resource in health care; now therefore be it 29 30 RESOLVED, The VMS urges the Green Mountain Care Board to partner with physicians and other 31 health professionals to develop a statewide health resource allocation plan that uses the medical 32 needs of all Vermonters as the underlying construct rather than a community market based approach 33 and the plan should weigh heavily issues of equity and patient centeredness; and be it further 34 35 RESOLVED, The VMS urges the Board to prioritize the current and future needs of the workforce 36 by ensuring an adequate primary care and mental health/substance abuse workforce that is readily 37 available to all Vermonters, as well as regionalized specialty medical and surgical workforce that is 38 reasonably available and a tertiary and quaternary workforce that is emergently available to all the

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state's residents.
