4	Establishing the Dr. Mildred A. Reardon Scholarshin
4 5	Establishing the Dr. Mildred A. Reardon Scholarship
6	Submitted to VMS Council by John P. Fogarty, M.D. on September 7, 2005
7	VMS Council Recommendation: Support
8

10	WHEREAS, The cost of a medical education at a public medical school has increased by
11	312 percent over the past 20 years creating a severe economic impediment to the
12	education and formation of physicians; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, The median debt carried by a medical school graduate is nearly \$100,000,
15	putting great financial pressure on graduates during their years of residency and first
16	years of practice; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, Among all medical schools, in 2003 the University of Vermont College of
19	Medicine ranked 14 <sup>th</sup> highest with an average debt of \$133,429 reflecting the relatively
20	high tuition for both resident and non-resident students, due to modest portion of the
21	overall budget provided by the State of Vermont and the lack of an extensive
22	endowment; and

24	WHEREAS, According to a 2003 article in the Journal of the American Medical
25	Association, Vermont is beginning to see the signs of a shortage of physicians,
26	particularly in its rural areas and among specialties; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, Vermont's comparatively low physician reimbursement rates make
29	practicing in Vermont particularly difficult for recent medical graduates with
30	outstanding medical school debt; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, Dr. Mildred "Mimi" Reardon has been in constant service of the Vermont
33	medical community for nearly 35 years, pioneering the Area Health Education Centers
34	Program, championing the hospice movement, and playing a leading role in the
35	formation of the Vermont Program for Quality in Health Care, Inc.,; and

37	WHEREAS, As Associate Dean for Primary Care at the University of Vermont's
38	College of Medicine, Dr. Reardon has displayed a passion for the education and training
39	of physicians;

41	WHEREAS, Through her efforts to gain Freeman Foundation support to aid medical
42	students, Dr. Reardon has shown a commitment to ensuring that financial need not be
43	an impediment to medical education; and

45	WHEREAS, Dr. Reardon has been instrumental in the formation of the Vermont
46	Medical Society Education and Research Fund, serving as an At-Large Director and as
47	the first Corporation President; and

- 2 WHEREAS, It is part of the mission of the Vermont Medical Society Education and
- 3 Research Fund to "provide grants and scholarships to deserving medical students
- 4 enrolled at the University of Vermont College of Medicine;

- 6 WHEREAS, The intent of such grants and scholarships is to "provide an incentive for
- 7 recipients to pursue a career in medicine and to provide motivation for recipients to8 practice in Vermont;" and

- 10 WHEREAS, This purpose could no more perfectly align with the values and efforts
- displayed by Dr. Reardon as a practitioner, educator, and leader of Vermont's medical community; therefore be it

- 14 **RESOLVED**, That the Vermont Medical Society, in collaboration with the
- 15 Vermont Medical Society Education and Research Fund, establish a scholarship in
- 16 the name of Mildred A. Reardon, M.D., to be presented at each year's annual
- 17 meeting to a deserving medical student enrolled at the University of Vermont
- 18 College of Medicine, in order to provide an incentive for students to pursue a
- 19 career in medicine and to provide motivation for graduates to practice medicine
- 20 in Vermont.
